## MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Bridge of Hope Lancaster & Chester Counties is to end and prevent homelessness for women and children with the help of trained mentoring teams within congregations. Single mothers achieve permanent housing and financial self sufficiency through employment and attain stability and enhanced self esteem through ongoing mentoring friendships. Our goal is to exemplify Christ's love and to promote physical, emotional, social, and spiritual wholeness.

## STATISTICS

- Core Program: 39 single mothers and their 80 children received support to move towards wholeness.
- Program Effectiveness: Over the past three years, 81% of the women completing the program graduate successfully, attaining financial stability through employment.
- Volunteer Mentors: 280 volunteer mentors from church mentoring teams provided care and encouragement to the families in the program.
- Other Volunteers: 621 other volunteers, 8 full-time staff, and 7 part-time staff helped make Bridge of Hope LCC's ministry possible. This is a staff to volunteer ratio of 1:78. The total volunteer hours of 5,618 have a value of \$321,382.
- Alumnae Program provided a support network for 121 Bridge of Hope graduates.
- Family Building Program provided home visits to strengthen parenting skills for 25 mothers and 46 children.
- Donated Vehicles: 9 mothers received donated cars from supporters.

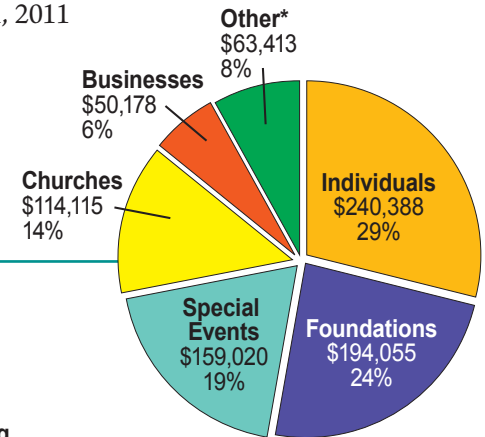

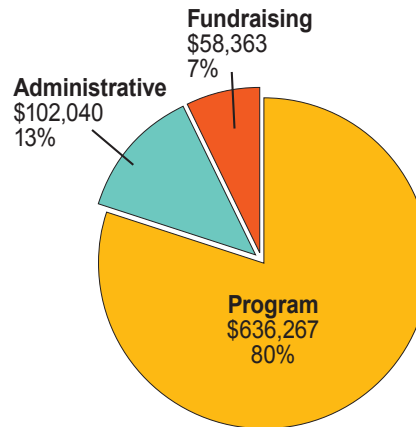
